

# QUARTER SQUARE TRIANGLES

## SINGLE BURST MINI QUILT

Light Value Fabric – Fat Quarter

- Cut (1) 8 ½" square

Medium Value Fabric – 3/8 yard

- Cut (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip
  - Subcut (2) 8 ½" and (2) 8" squares

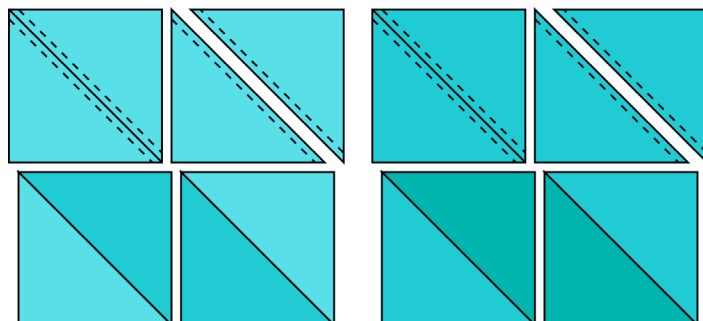
Dark Value Fabric – ½ yard

- Cut (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip
  - Subcut (1) 8 ½" and (2) 8" squares
- Cut (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips
  - Subcut (2) 2 ½" x 21" and (2) 2 ½" x 18 ½" rectangles

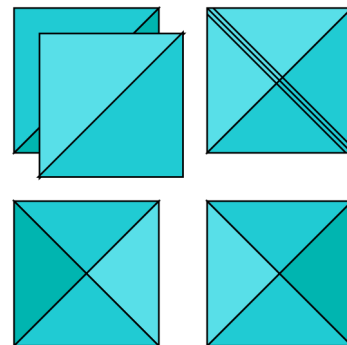
Backing – 24" x 30" rectangle / ¼ yard

Binding – 3/8 yard

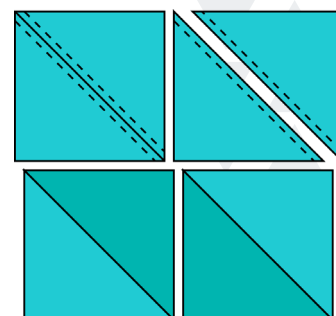
1. Pair (1) Light value and (1) Medium value 8 ½" square right sides together (RST). Using a fabric marking device of your choice, draw a line diagonally on the wrong side of the lighter fabric. Sew a scant ¼" seam allowance on either side of the marked line. Cut apart on the marked diagonal line.
2. Repeat with (1) Medium value and (1) Dark value 8 ½" square.
3. Press all seams toward the Medium value fabric to create (4) half-square triangles (HSTs) and leave untrimmed.



4. Pair (1) Light/Medium HST and (1) Medium/Dark HST RST nesting the seams. Draw a line diagonally on the wrong side of the lighter HST. Sew a scant ¼" seam allowance on either side of the marked line. Cut apart on the marked diagonal line. Press seams open. Trim to create (2) 7 ½" hourglass blocks.



5. Pair (1) Medium value and (1) Dark value 8" square RST. Draw a line diagonally on the wrong side of the lighter fabric. Sew a scant ¼" seam allowance on either side of the marked line. Cut apart on the marked diagonal line. Press seams open. Repeat and trim to create (4) 7 ½" HSTs.



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6. Arrange blocks as shown in the Single Burst Mini Quilt Assembly Diagram. Pressing seams open, blocks into rows and rows together. Pressing seams open, sew the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $21\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles to the sides and then the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $21\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles to the top and bottom to make an  $18\frac{1}{2}$ " by  $25\frac{1}{2}$ " quilt top.
7. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top. Baste the layers together using your preferred method. Quilt as desired.
8. From binding fabric, cut (3)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips and join the strips together using your preferred joining technique to create a double folded binding roll. Trim quilt square and bind using your favorite binding technique.

The Single Burst Mini Quilt can be a great practice piece to apply the tips for piecing precision that I cover in the Fresh Quilting technique segment. 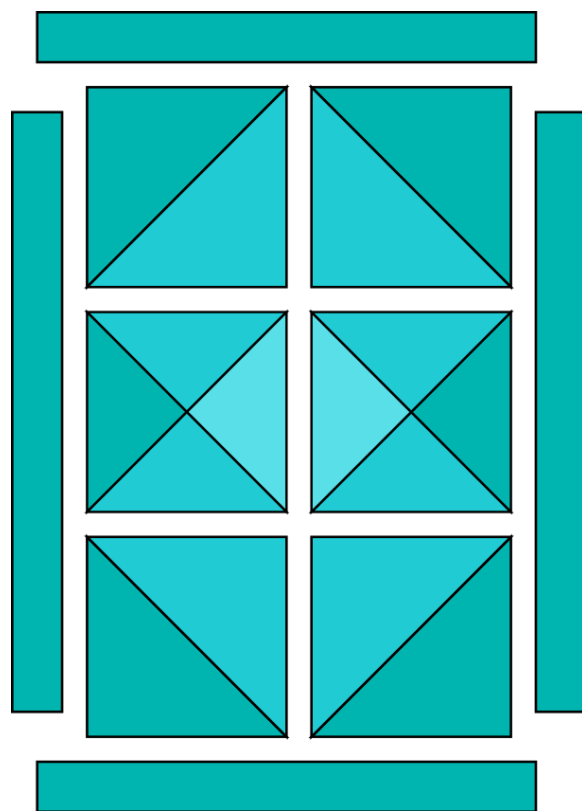
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Single Burst Mini Quilt Assembly Diagram
