

FREE FORM APPLIQUE BOUQUETS

ANNA MARIA HORNER



Combining patchwork and applique can make dynamic and appealing bouquets.

- When composing, keep in mind the three main components are the back ground, leaf/steam color, flowerwork.
- Piecing the background in similar tones and colors can add interest.
- Floral elements can be built from traditional quilting elements, like nine-patches, dresdens, etc. Don't feel limited by traditional colors.
- Improvisationally lay out your design and piece as you design.
- Orphan blocks are great for this type of design work,
- Bias strips can add curved stems.
- Add fusible to your fabric, to make quick and easy machine appliqued pieces.
- Use decorative stitches to machine applique for added interest and strength
