

## MINI QUILT TO PILLOW WITH CATHERINE CURETON

### Supplies:

- A mini quilt that has been quilted and is ready to bind. Shown is the Lil' Pointless Pattern by Running Doe Quilts
- Fabric for backing style of your choice
- Binding of your choice
- Any extra notions you may need for your backing (zippers etc)
- Basic sewing supplies: Rotary cutter, ruler, mat, thread, pins, iron, machine...

### Notes:

- You can bind almost any way you like. It will still look and hang or lay like a traditional mini when the pillow is out.
  - The mini doesn't have to be a standard square or rectangle- get creative!
  - If your quilt is square or rectangular, use a square ruler to square off the corners.
- Standard binding will turn best if the corners are exactly 90°
- Running Doe Quilts has a great selection of quick & easy mini quilt patterns available

### If you need a custom insert for your pillow:

1. Cut 2 pieces of cotton fabric the same size as your mini quilt. You won't see it so the print/ color doesn't matter.
2. Sew with the right sides together all the way around using the same seam allowance you used to attach your binding. Leave a small opening (approximately hands width) for turning and stuffing.
3. Turn the insert right side out.
4. Stuff with polyfill or other stuffing.
5. Stitch the opening closed.
6. Insert into pillow.
